March Millennium Memo



A couple months ago, I reported on the very strong home sale market in Palomar East. That article prompted this note from Kasey: "This is the busiest month I've had for home sales. I'm working on 10 applications, and it appears they will all close escrow."

Given such sales activity and knowing how busy Kasey is, you'll want to do everything you can to ensure a smooth closing. With that in mind...

If You're Thinking of Selling Your Home

There's an oddity in the Mobilehome Residency Law. You have the right to sell your home to anyone you want. However, your Buyer doesn't have the right to actually live in Palomar East unless he or she is approved for residency. That sounds like a technicality, but it isn't really.

Of course, most Buyers do end up qualifying for residency. The two main questions: (1) Do they satisfy the 55-and-older age restriction, and (2) Can they actually afford to live here, i.e. do they meet the income/credit standards.

The approval process isn't complicated, but just to be safe, have your Buyer apply early on, so your closing isn't delayed because of paperwork. Kasey—and your Buyer—will thank you.

In Other News...

- This month's Staff Kudo goes to Patty Mackey, who covered the Office for a week while Kasey was out sick—and kudos to you, for going easy on her. Folks were nice to you, weren't they, Patty?
- As Spring approaches, it's time for your **PEERA Board** to work on its **Wish List** for the new Fiscal Year, which starts July 1. We've spent about \$500K on streets in the past couple years, but there's still some money available for new projects. If you have any great ideas, I'm sure PEERA wants to hear from you.
- Kasey wants me to remind you to fill out a **Space Improvement Form** before starting your exciting new project, but you don't need to hear that again do you?

I'll spare the long harangue if you promise to **talk to Kasey** about your landscaping upgrade, home addition, new fence, tree, porch, decking, or other exterior project before getting underway. Is that a deal?

Regarding that last item... while I was at Home Depot recently, I overheard a customer trying to buy some 2 x 4s.

The salesperson asked: "How long do you need them?"

The customer replied: "It's for my house, so probably about 30 or 40 years."

Space Improvement Forms & Permits

I know I went over this recently but its important. Before any work can begin on the exterior of your home you must have a Space Improvement Form approved. Residents need to inform the park if they are adding landscaping around their home, adding or removing a shed, or installing a fence. There are guidelines in the rules and regulations. We don't want you to spend time and money on something that is not park approved and will require change. Permits are required if you are having work done on your roof or windows installed on your home. Workers need to have necessary permits in hand before work can begin. If you plan on installing or changing something, please contact the office.

Outside Storage

Please keep the exterior of your property not only clear of weeds but clean from item storage. If you are storing items around the exterior of your property, they need to be stored in your home or shed. Or possibly in an outside storage locker. Please keep your home exterior looking nice so the park looks nice.
