In last month's newsletter, we were so excited to be expanding the number of articles we could provide, that we forgot about something currently very important—

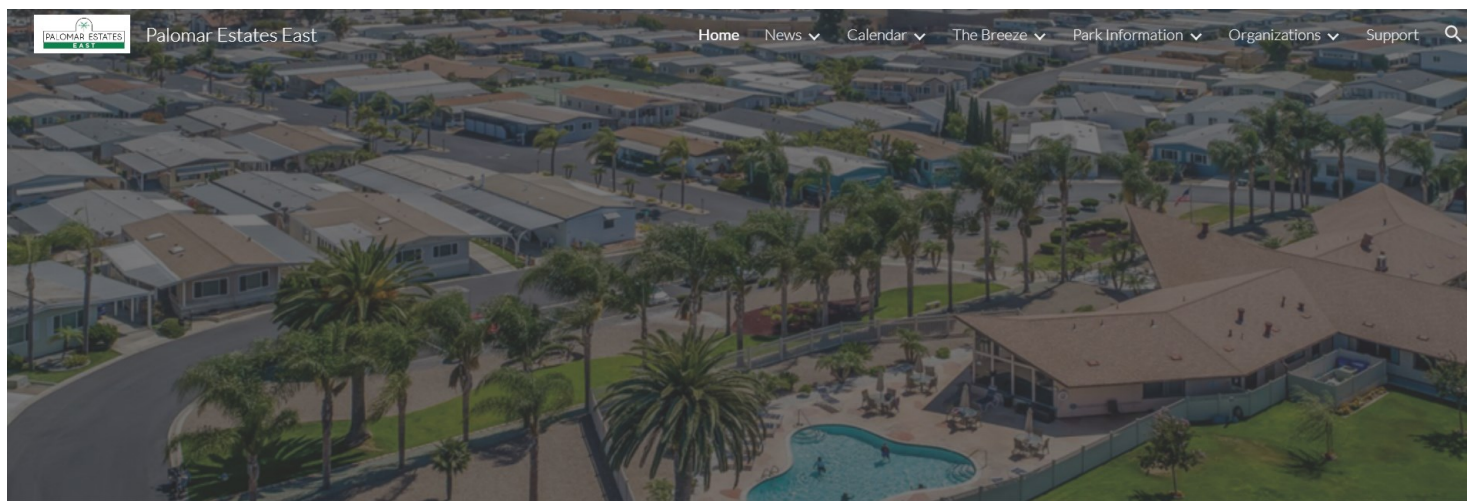
Supply Chain Issues!

A Final Thought

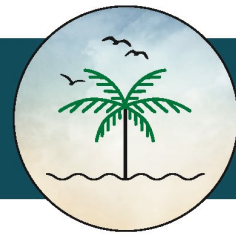
Last month, for Father's Day, I gave my dad \$100 and told him to buy something that would make my life easier. He used it to buy a present for my mom.

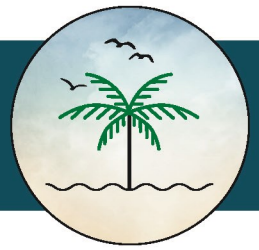

What's in Your Backyard?

Would you eat an apple and then throw it out in your backyard?

Of course you wouldn't. One of the easiest—but most important things you can do to control pests, diseases, and airborne spores—is to pick up all the fruit that falls during the season. We call this practice “**yard hygiene.**”

If you leave fruit lying on the ground, there's a chance the brown rot can spread into the fruit on the tree that is still healthy. You also don't want to leave brown rot spores around for the insects to carry around in your yard or your neighbors. So, it's important to pick the fruit up and completely remove fallen fruit from the area.

Summer Walks & Dog Paws

Friendly reminder to check the pavement for heat before taking your dog on a walk.

- ◆ Place your hand or a bare foot on the surface for 10 seconds. If it is too hot for you to keep your hand or foot on it, then it is too hot for your pet.
- ◆ Avoid the hottest parts of the day.
- ◆ Walk early in the morning or in the evening after the pavement has cooled down.
